IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING NOTICE

INTERNET USE AT HOME

For many adults we see our online lives and offline lives as different, but children are growing up with technology and the internet and for them there isn't a difference; online life and offline life is just life.

Technology can move at an extraordinarily fast pace and it can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they are doing online, who they might be speaking to, or discussing the potential risks and issues that come with being online.

Talking regularly with your child is the greatest tool to help keep them safe online. Having conversations about online activity and making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed about the subject. It also means that when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you.

However, it can also be easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available, and the potential risks.

The NSPCC have some excellent advice on their webpage so please do have a look at it. A core part of the NSPCC's 10-year strategy is to ensure children are safe online. To help achieve this they have teamed up with the LEGO Group to help promote their fun, free Build & Talk activities. The six 'adventures' help parents and caregivers talk with their children about key online safety topics through the joy of LEGO play. Advice If Your Child Accesses YouTube

When used safely and responsibly, YouTube provides children with a wealth of opportunities to learn, stay entertained, create and play. However with so much content available, how do you find the correct channels and videos? How do you ensure your child is safe while watching them?

It is important to have a **shared family account** for YouTube so you can easily track what videos are watched and suggested. The www.internetmatters.org website recommends **turning Restricted Mode on** or, for younger children, setting up **YouTube Kids**. Supervised Accounts are for parents who want to allow their child to transition from YouTube Kids to the main YouTube platform. You can refer to the step-by-step parental settings guide, which you will find on the www.internetmatters.org website, to help keep children safe on YouTube.

Do you know what content your child watches on YouTube? A good approach is to restrict your child from watching certain YouTube channels. If they want to start watching a new one, then it is a good idea to watch some videos yourselves first to vet the content. Some suggested channels you could view to see if you are happy with them before introducing your children to them are: Peacock Kids, Mother Goose Club, Talking Tom & Friends and National Geographic Kids. These are all good examples of YouTube channels for children under 10. If you view recent videos, but also browse the channel's back catalogue, the YouTube algorithms often suggest these older videos for young viewers to watch next if they already watch the channel.

Tip: Subscribe to channels that you feel comfortable with. This creates a feed of safe videos for your children to browse and watch in the 'Subscriptions' area of YouTube.

WHAT SAFETY FEATURES DOES YOUTUBE HAVE?

YouTube is considered a search engine, video-sharing platform and social media platform all-inone. It has a lot of features that support each type of content. However, it also includes settings to promote safety and wellbeing to keep children safe online. If you do not put any safety restrictions in place then your child will be able to access any video on YouTube, including videos with an age recommendation of viewers over 18 only.

YouTube Kids is a separate app made for children under 13. It allows a safer and simpler experience for them to explore. The app also has a parent-supervised experience to help guide your children on their journey. You can view the <u>YouTube Kids app parental control guide</u> for more information.

Privacy settings – Under-18s can set privacy settings to make parts of their profile private and as well as making posted content private or public.

Digital wellbeing – YouTube contains a variety of wellbeing tools. Users can turn off autoplay to limit endless scrolling. The platform also has the option to 'Remind me to take a break' and 'Remind me when it's bedtime' to encourage users to take breaks. You can turn these features on in settings.

Mature content or 'Not made for kids' - content creators can include an age-restrict option on their content not made for viewers under 18. Personalised ads are removed on content made for kids on their 'watch' page. However, ads are still shown based on the context of the video. Monetised features are also removed.

Trusted Flagger program - removes harmful content from the platform.

Machine learning - their machine learning systems identify videos that may put children at risk. They also apply a few protection tools, such as restricting live features, disabling comments and limiting recommendations. YouTube also works with NGOs to combat child sexual abuse imagery (CSAI) by reporting this type of content to the relevant law agencies.

Autoplay customisation on YouTube Kids – On YouTube Kids, parents can turn off autoplay features as well as erasing history to manage what kinds of videos children experience.

Safeguards and education about commercial content – YouTube do not allow paid product placements in YouTube Kids as they do on the standard app.

Reporting: when a video or channel is reported to YouTube, it is investigated. If it goes against their guidelines or policies, they will terminate the account in question. If they find any sexually inappropriate content featuring minors, they will also report the illegal activities to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In all, YouTube takes keeping children safe online seriously. However, as a parent you also have to do your part by making sure you know what content your child is watching, and by putting restrictions in place.

Government and Local Council Resources

The government have an online tool to help people check the benefits and financial support they might be able to apply for. You can check at:

Your local council may be able to help you pay for things like:

- Energy and water bills;
- Food;
- Essential items such as clothes or even an oven.

This help is known as Welfare Assistance or the Household Support Fund. Each council runs its own scheme. The help they offer, and who can get it, varies. Ask your local council if they run one of these schemes. You do not have to be in receipt of benefits to get help from your local council. If you are in receipt of benefits, they will not be affected if you get help from one of these schemes. See below for information on the WSCC Community Hub.

COMMUNITY HUB

WSCC have a community hub for anyone who may need help. You can request support from the Hub, including accessing the Household Support Fund, and where to get advice.

WSCC are focused on making sure they continue to support the most vulnerable people in our community.

If your request is urgent, for example, you are going to run out of food within the next two days, please phone <u>033 022 27980</u> so that they can make sure you get the help you need as quickly as possible.



CHANGE OF DETAILS

If any of your contact details change (address, home phone, mobile etc), please inform the school office so they can update the school records accordingly.

MEDICATION

From time to time we will sometimes administer paracetamol to a child if they are feeling unwell, but it is not necessary to send them home. The brand we use is either Calpol paracetamol 6+ sachets or meltlets (so cannot be administered to anyone under 6 years old). For this to be administered to your child you will have needed to have signed a form giving your permission. We will always telephone you to get your permission before we administer any paracetamol, but without the signed consent form we cannot administer it in any event. If you have already signed a permission slip you do not need to do anything else. The above is also relevant for antihistamine's. We use Piriton, but only if the parent has provided written consent and also verbal consent just before it is administered.

TRIM TRAIL AND TYRE TRAIL

At the end of the school day it has been noted that parents are allowing their children to play on the trim trail outside the classrooms. If you do allow your child to use the trim trail (or tyres) at drop off/collection time it is **your responsibility** to ensure they use it safely. Please keep an eye on your children at all times during drop off/collection to/from school to ensure their safety.

MOBILE PHONES

Please can you remind your child that if they bring a mobile phone to school with them, they must **not** use the phone whilst on the school premises. All phones must be turned off when your child has arrived at school, and handed to their class teacher. All phones will be returned at the end of the school day.

BIRTHDAYS AND TREATS

We love birthdays, and we love celebrating them even more! If you provide sweets for a class in order to celebrate your child's birthday, we would ask that you ensure they are individually wrapped, nut free and, if possible, vegetarian. This will mean all of your child's classmates can celebrate their birthday with them. We are not able to hand out any cakes or sweets that are homemade.

Also, from time to time throughout the school year, we will give out sweet treats to children. We will ensure we always meet a child's dietary requirements. Please inform the school if you do not want your child to be given any sweet treats.

ASTHMA INHALERS/AUTO INJECTORS

If we hold an asthma inhaler or auto injector for your child, please be aware that we need two, one in the classroom, and one in our medical room. When that item is out of date we will contact you and ask you to provide us ones that are in date. Please make sure that you provide us in date items as a matter of priority. It is for your child's safety and must be acted upon immediately.

FILMS AT CHRISTMAS AND EASTER (AND THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL YEAR)

Mainly at Christmas and Easter time we will sometimes arrange for the children to watch a film as an end of term treat. The films will either be a 'U' or 'PG' certificate. We would never show a film that we judged to be inappropriate. However, if you do not wish your child to watch a 'PG' certificate film then please let the school office know so that a different film can be chosen for your child's class to watch.

NO NUTS REMINDER

Please remember that we are a 'No Nuts' school. This means that no food brought into school by either children or staff should contain nuts. This includes Nutella (there are other alternative chocolate spreads available that do not contain nuts).
